## **NOVELTY CLASSES 1-11:**

Each of these classes has sections for under 10s, 10-15 years and adults.

- 1. A TRUG FULL OF FLOWERS, FRUIT AND VEGETABLES
- 2. A VASE OF MIXED FLOWERS
- 3. THE MOST IMPRESSIVE SUNFLOWER single or multi-headed.

#### 4. A BOWL OF FRUIT

Any mixture of fruit from your garden or allotment, the bowl to be no more than 30cm in diameter

#### 'MY GARDEN IN MINIATURE' Make your garden in a container no larger than a 36 x 22cm seed tray.

- 6. A DECORATED 1 LITRE FLOWERPOT
- 7. YOUR BAKE-OFF 'HARVEST FESTIVAL' CAKE show-stopper, judged on mouth-watering appearance.
- 8. THE MOST IMPRESSIVE WEED displayed in a vase.
- 9. THE LONGEST RUNNER BEAN
- 10. THE SMALLEST RIPE TOMATO a magnifying glass will be available for viewing!
- THE BIGGEST SLUG displayed in a closed jam jar (a volunteer will release the giant molluscs back into the wild after the show)

## INDIVIDUAL CLASSES 12-35: FLOWERS, FRUIT AND VEG.

(One entry per person in each class)

- 12. A VASE OF DAHLIAS
- 13. 5 OR 6 STEMS OF FLOWERS FROM YOUR GARDEN
- 14. 1 STEM OF ROSE single- or cluster-flowered.
- 15. 3 DIFFERENT ANNUALS two stems of each.
- 16. 3 DIFFERENT PERENNIALS one stem of each.
- 17. 1 BLOOM OF HYDRANGEA
- **18.** AN INDOOR POT PLANT grown for flower or foliage, but not a cactus or succulent.
- 19. A CACTUS OR SUCCULENT GROWN IN A POT
- 20. A COLLECTION OF 4 DIFFERENT VEGETABLES one example of each.
- 21. 10 CHERRY TOMATOES displayed on the paper plate provided.
- **22. 6 TOMATOES** any kind except cherry tomatoes displayed on the paper plate provided.
- 23. 4 ONIONS, SEED OR SET GROWN with roots trimmed and tops tied.
- 24. 4 COURGETTES no longer than 15cm long. Leave the flower on if you can.
- 25. 3 BEETROOTS any variety, tops cut to about 6cm.
- 26. 3 CARROTS any variety, tops cut to about 6cm.
- 27. 2 COBS OF SWEETCORN partially stripped to show the corn.
- 28. 4 CHILLIES
- 29. 6 RUNNER BEANS leave the stalk on.
- 30. 6 FRENCH BEANS leave the stalk on.
- 31. 5 POTATOES any colour displayed on the paper plate provided.

- 32. 1 LETTUCE as picked.
- 33. 4 EATING APPLES
- 34. 4 SPECIMENS OF ANY OTHER FRUIT except berry fruits displayed on the paper plate provided.
- 35. 20 RASPBERRIES hull left in, displayed on the paper plate provided.

- WHAT YOU CAN ENTER: Your entries must be grown or made by you, and they should not have been entered in any previous Appleton Show.
- **TO ENTER:** Fill in the entry form available on the village website (https:// www.appleton-eaton.org) or the village hall website ((https:// www.appletonvillagehall.com), and place it with the entry fee in the box in the Village Shop by 6pm closing time on **Wednesday 21 August 2024**.
- STAGE YOUR EXHIBITS in the Village Hall between 8.30am and 10.30am on the day of the Show. You will need to supply your own vases, stands, etc. unless the schedule says otherwise. We will give you a competitor slip to place by each of your entries. At 10.30am we will clear the Hall for judging.
- JUDGING this year will be more informal and the judges will choose either the best or their favourite entry in each class. In time-honoured tradition, the judges' decisions will be final, and they may not make an award if they don't think the entries are good enough.
- **PRIZES:** There will be prizes and certificates awarded this year instead of trophies. The prize-giving will take place at 3.30pm.
- **TAKING HOME YOUR ENTRIES:** Please wait until after the prizegiving before removing your entries. There will not be an auction of produce this year.
